Te Tauihu Tangata Whenua Tangihanga Guidelines During Covid-19 Alert Level 4, 3, 2 & 1

He āwhina, he aroha, ngā miro tuitui i ngā haehaetanga o te mate (Love and support knit together the lacerations of anguish)

Tēnā tātou katoa,

These guidelines are an accompaniment for those prepared for Alert Level 4 and are offered to assist us as we move down the COVID-19 alert levels. These guidelines have been prepared to help us during this difficult time. They are based on the tikanga of ngā iwi o Te Tauihu and support the official guidelines for tangihanga during Alert Levels 4, 3, 2 & 1. These guidelines may be subject to change, please also visit the Ministry of Health website.

We have Pouwhakarite who are available to provide cultural guidance throughout this process as well as support with Karakia, Karanga and other Tikanga practices should whānau wish for this assistance. GUIDELINES TO SUPPORT YOU AND YOUR WHĀNAU:

- Your Funeral Director must be engaged to help guide you through the process when your whanaunga is nearing the end of life and when they pass away.
- Should you require cultural support we have Pouwhakarite to assist you during this time.

WHANAUNGA PASSES AWAY IN HOSPITAL

Cultural support will be provided within the hospital by Te Waka Hauora/Māori Health. Ask for: Tui Lister (Whakatū/Nelson) or Shaun Wharehoka (Wairau/Blenheim).

The hospital may contact the Police depending on circumstances.

WHANAUNGA PASSES AWAY AT HOME

Whānau representative must contact:

- Your whanaunga GP or usual health provider.
- > A Funeral Director.
- Depending on the circumstances the Police may need to be contacted.

If the cause of death is unknown, then a post mortem may need to be undertaken.

The Funeral Director will uplift your whanaunga. Please be aware that they will be wearing full protective clothing.

IF YOUR WHANAUNGA PASSES AWAY OVERSEAS/OUTSIDE REGION OR

WHANAUNGA FROM ELSEWHERE PASSES AWAY IN TE TAU IHU

- Alert level 4 strictly no interregional or overseas traval is permitted.
- During Alert Level 2 and 3: Travel across region will require an exemption
- Overseas tūpāpaku will be able to be repatriated provided the funeral director meets the international requirements for Customs and Biosecurity.

In all these cases, your Funeral Director will be able to support.

Also consider contacting:

- Your iwi to activate support.
- WINZ— to activate financial tangihanga support to those who qualify.
- Māori urupā trustees if this is the planned burial choice.
- Iwi, hapū, whānau, others to inform them of the passing of your whanaunga & burial/cremation details.
- Your Funeral Director to discuss the possibility of livestreaming the burial/cremation or other video solutions.

Overview of different alert level requirements for Tangihanga

PLEASE REMEMBER:

- If you are hosting a tangihanga, you must display a QR code and a contact register.
- Provide hand sanitiser.
- To manage communications, it is advisable to appoint a person to guide visitors. Pouwhakarite may be available to support this for you whānau.
- If you are unwell, please do not attend tangihanga to keep yourself safe and for the safety of others.
