Our staff are here to provide professional planning analysis and support to the Trust to ensure that cultural values, matters, issues and views of Te Atiawa are brought to the attention of central government agencies, local government authorities, developers and applicants and sites of cultural significance are protected.

With more than 20 years' working experience and knowledge of the Resource Management Act 1991 and related legislation, our small but dedicated staff work hard to support to the Trust on any and all planning matters that may impact on Te Atiawa.

Rohe

Te Ātiawa o Te Waka-a-Māui Trust is the iwi mandated organisation that represents those Te Ātiawa people who whakapapa to Te Tau Ihu. For the purpose of resource management, Te Tau Ihu is divided into 3 principal rohe as explained in figure 1 (see below).



Figure 1: Te Ātiawa resource management rohe within Te Tau Ihu.

Issues, applications or developments that fall within these rohe are dealt with by separate agencies while the Rohe Management office (based in Waikawa) provides planning advice to all these agencies.

Manawhenua Ki Mohua – Phone (03), Onetahua Marae. Manawhenua Ki Mohua is an iwi mandated organisation representing Ngati Tama, Ngati Rārua and Te Ātiawa within the area defined as the Golden Bay catchment and Kahurangi National Park area (i.e. Western side of Takaka Hill).

Tiakina te Taiao – Phone (03) 546 7842. Tiakina is the mandated organisation to represent Ngati Tama, Ngati Rārua, Te Ātiawa, NRAIT, and Whakatū within the area defined as the Nelson basin (the area encompassing the Nelson Regional Authority Boundary and the southern portion of the Tasman Regional Boundary (i.e. Eastern side of and south of Takaka Hill).

Te Ātiawa Marlborough – Phone (03) 573 5170, Waikawa Marina. The Ātiawa Marlborough office is mandated with the area described as the Marlborough Regional Authority boundary and the Kaikoura District Council boundary.

As a matter of process, all queries regarding policy input, resource consents, and/or cultural matters should be directed to the relevant area office of Te Ātiawa o Te Waka-a-Māui.

Te Tau Ihu is a significant portion of Te Waipounamu. The area contains: three separate unitary authorities; two regional authorities; three district authorities; and two Department of Conservation conservancies. Within the jurisdiction of these decision-making bodies there are constant issues and concerns for Te Atiawa. See below for a brief description of current issues.

MEP further submissions – Further submissions on the Proposed Marlborough Environment (MEP) Plan have been lodged with the Marlborough District Council. Hearings are set down for the end of the year. It is likely that the hearing process will be protracted and it will be well into the new year before the Proposed MEP advances. The RM office has opposed those submissions which seek to diminish cultural and iwi recognition.

Resource Consents – The RM Office has been receiving a steady line of applications for developments within the totaranui rohe and pre-lodgement (with MDC) engagement is open and largely successful. MDC is informing applicants to consult with Te Atiawa for any and all applications in our rohe. This affords Te Atiawa the opportunity to discuss and resolve issues before any formal process is instigated.



CMS – The RM Office has been working closely with the Department of Conservation (DOC) on pest management work and concession applications. DOC has indicated that a review of the Conservation Management Strategy for Nelson/Marlborough conservancy will be started at the end of the year. This will be a substantial piece of planning work which will determine how the Ministry will deal with issues (and principally iwi) for the next 15 to 20 years.



Tiakina te Taiao has indicated that the Whakatū rohe is steady with resource consent applications and developments. National statistics indicate that this area is one of the fastest growing areas in the country which places pressure on resources and cultural values.



Regional Council RPS & Plan Review – The Nelson City Council continues to review its'
Regional Policy Statement and their Resource Management Plan. The RM Office
(through Tiakina te Taiao) is continuing to put forward the issues of concern to Te
Atiawa so that the new planning documents better reflect and provide for cultural values and protection.



Manawhenua Ki Mohua advise that mining applications are consuming a great deal of their time and there is considerable pressure to explore for gold in some of our more significant areas. The RM Office is support MKM through the ministerial approval processes and resource consent processes to ensure that our values are protected.



Regional Council Plan Review – The Tasman District Council is undertaking several Plan
Changes to their operative Resource Management Plan. The RM Office (through
Manawhenua ki Mohua) is continuing to put forward the issues of concern to Te
Atiawa so that the new plan provisions provide greater engagement with Te Atiawa
and protect those resources which are significant to our iwi.
